3 Processing of personal data

3.1 Categories and types of data

If we instruct you, the data we enter in the relevant application or order form will be collected, and in particular this may include the following information:

- Salutation, title, first name, last name, company
- Address
- E-mail address
- Telephone number (landline and/or mobile)
- Contract data (organisational data, payment data, invoice data)
- If applicable, further contact details, e.g. for messenger services, fax number or similar (if indicated).
- Account details, if applicable

In addition, all information is collected that is necessary for the fulfilment of the contract with you.

3.2 Purposes of data processing

We process and use your personal data exclusively for the purposes of contract fulfilment and for business purposes permitted within the scope of our business activities.

The processing of personal data takes place,

- for correspondence with you;
- to be able to identify you as a supplier;
- in order to be able to fulfil our contractual obligations towards you;
- in order to comply with our legal obligations (e.g. archiving and retention obligations) ;
- for invoice processing
- on quality assurance
- to assert any claims against you or third parties.

3.3 Legal basis of the processing

The processing of personal data takes place on the occasion of your commissioning by us and is necessary for the stated purposes for the processing of our commission and for the fulfilment of obligations from the respective underlying commission.

The legal basis for the processing of your personal data is regularly the fulfilment of contractual obligations or the processing in the course of contract initiation pursuant to Art. 6 (1b) GDPR. In the case of voluntary information, the processing is based on the consent given in accordance with Art. 6 (1a) GDPR.

Insofar as further data may not be directly required for the implementation of the contractual relationship, the processing is based on a legitimate interest of the company pursuant to Art. 6 (1f) GDPR.

A legitimate interest may arise, for example, for internal organisational and administrative purposes, to protect the company's facilities, equipment and assets, and data processing equipment and data. Processing of your data is permissible here if the protection of your interests, fundamental rights and freedoms does not prevail.

In addition, a legal obligation within the meaning of Art. 6 (1c) GDPR may also justify data processing. This applies in particular to the storage and retention of payment and tax-related documents.

3.4 Recipients of your data

Recipients of your data are internal departments for which this is necessary to fulfil the above-mentioned purposes. These may also be service providers for whom an order processing relationship exists in accordance with Art. 28 GDPR.

3.5 Duration of storage

The personal data collected will be stored until the purpose of the processing no longer applies. Data for which there is a legal obligation to retain records (e. g. in accordance with the German Commercial Code (HGB), the German Criminal Code (StGB) or the German Tax Code (AO)) will be deleted after expiry of this retention obligation (e. g. for merchants 6 or 10 years after expiry of the calendar year in which the contractual relationship was terminated).

Longer storage may take place on the basis of a legitimate interest or on the basis of your explicit consent.

4 Disclosure of data to third parties

As a matter of principle, your personal data will not be transferred to third parties. Exceptions to this only apply if this is necessary for the processing of contractual relationships with you. This includes in particular the transfer to service providers commissioned by us (so-called order processors) or other third parties whose activities are necessary for the execution of the contract (e.g. shipping companies or banks). The data passed on may be used by the third parties exclusively for the purposes stated.

The legal basis for this is Art. 6 Para. 1b) GDPR, the initiation or fulfilment of the contract and Art. 6 Para. 1f) GDPR, the legitimate interest in centralising certain processes within the group of companies. The members of the group of companies are:

5 Your rights as a data subject

As a data subject, you have various rights:

- **Right of revocation:** You can revoke your consent at any time. The data processing based on the revoked consent may then no longer be continued for the future.
- **Right to information:** You can request information about your personal data processed by us. This applies in particular to the purposes of the data processing, the categories of personal data, the categories of recipients, if applicable, the storage period, the origin of your data, if applicable, and the existence of automated decision-making, including profiling, if applicable, and meaningful information on its details.
- **Right to rectification:** You can request the rectification of incorrect or the completion of your personal data stored by us.
- **Right to erasure:** You can request the erasure of your personal data stored by us, insofar as its processing is not necessary for the exercise of the right to freedom of expression and information, for the fulfilment of a legal obligation, for reasons of public interest or for the assertion, exercise or defence of legal claims.
- **Right to restriction of processing:** You can request the restriction of the processing of your personal data if you dispute the accuracy of the data, the processing is unlawful, but you refuse to delete it. You also have this right if we no longer need the data but you need it to assert, exercise or defend legal claims. Furthermore, you have this right if you have objected to the processing of your personal data;

- **Right to data portability:** You may request that we transfer the personal data you have provided to us in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format. Alternatively, you may request the direct transfer of the personal data you have provided to us to another controller, where this is possible.

- **Right to complain (complaints body):** You can complain to a data protection supervisory authority, e. g. if you believe that we are processing your personal data in an unlawful manner. You have the right to complain about our processing of personal data to a data protection supervisory authority.
